## Executive Summary

Since its inception in 2012, Shanti Foundation has been a catalyst for transformative change in Uttar Pradesh, particularly in Maharajganj, driving significant socio-economic progress. The impact is distinctly evident across four key areas — employment, income generation, education, and healthcare access.

### Employment and Income Generation

Beyond enhancing healthcare access, the Foundation's establishment of a medical college, hospital, and multiple educational institutes has already begun transforming the district's economic landscape. By **directly employing over 800 individuals** across various capacities, it has provided stable, well-paying jobs in a region historically challenged by unemployment.

This surge in employment across healthcare, education, and support services has revitalized the local labor market, with expansion plans set to **double this workforce within the next four years**.

The Foundation's economic influence extends well beyond direct employment - **each job created has stimulated nearly two additional jobs in allied sectors**, benefiting local vendors, suppliers, and service providers. **Transportation services have expanded**, with more drivers, logistics companies, and transport businesses

catering to staff, students, and patients. The **hospitality sector has flourished**, with hundreds of new hotels, restaurants, and retail businesses emerging to meet the growing demand. Additionally, **infrastructure development has accelerated**, driving growth in construction and real estate as the region adapts to its evolving needs.

The income impact is equally substantial. The Foundation's employees earn an average annual income of around **₹164,000**, **nearly twice the per capita income of Uttar Pradesh**. This higher income boosts local spending, strengthens the district's economy, and enables families to invest in education, breaking the cycle of poverty. It also fosters a self-sustaining economy, reduces migration, and creates long-term career growth and stability for Maharajganj's residents.

### Education

Addressing the district's education gap, the Foundation has provided **free or concessional education to over 5,000 students** since 2012. With a female literacy rate of just 49%, far below the state average of 58%, many young women face barriers like poverty, societal norms, and lack of access to higher education.

Early marriage, household responsibilities, and high tuition fees often force them to abandon their dreams.

To change this, the Foundation introduced nursing and paramedical courses — ANM, GNM, B.Sc. Nursing, and paramedical training — allowing young women to pursue careers without leaving their hometown. The response has been overwhelming: more women are enrolling, completing their education, and securing stable jobs in healthcare.

This initiative is not just about education but empowerment. Women who once had limited opportunities are now earning independently, supporting their families, and challenging societal norms. With each graduate, Maharajganj moves closer to a future where education is a right, not a privilege. Through its commitment, the Foundation is fostering a generation of confident, self-reliant changemakers.

### Healthcare access

Maharajganj, with only one medical college and hospital, has long struggled to meet its healthcare needs. To address the region's growing demand for medical services, the Shanti Foundation expanded its healthcare and educational footprint by establishing **KMC Medical College & Hospital** under a **Public-Private Partnership (PPP)** with the Government of Uttar Pradesh in 2024 — **the first of its kind in the district**.

The launch of KMC Medical College & Hospital is transforming the region by providing specialized care and significantly reducing the strain on the existing medical

infrastructure. Patients from **seven districts** and neighboring areas of **Bihar and Nepal**, who previously had limited options and had to travel to Gorakhpur or Lucknow for treatment, now have access to **timely and high-quality medical care closer to home**, eliminating the need for long-distance travel. The hospital served around **783,000 out-patients** and **60,000 in-patients** between June 2023 and February 2025.

The Foundation has further revolutionized healthcare access by offering outpatient consultations at just **₹20, which is one-tenth of the fees charged by larger hospitals**. Additionally, several patients receive **free or concessional treatment**, making healthcare more accessible to low-income families. Empaneled under the **Ayushman Bharat Scheme**, KMC Medical College provides economically disadvantaged families with **health insurance coverage of up to ₹5 lakh**, making healthcare more affordable.

Founded in 2012 by the Srivastava family, Shanti Foundation is a prominent healthcare-focused non-profit organization based in Maharajganj, Uttar Pradesh. The foundation is dedicated to providing accessible, high-quality healthcare services across the Purvanchal region through advanced medical facilities and educational initiatives. The major units of the foundation are:

- KMC Digital Hospital
- KMC Nursing & Paramedical Institute
- KMC College of Nursing
- ITM College of Pharmacy
- Divya College of Special Education
- Divya College of Health Sciences
- KMC Medical College & Hospital

**KMC Digital Hospital**, a 665-bed multi-specialty facility, offers services in areas such as cardiology, endocrinology, gastroenterology, nephrology, neurology, oncology, orthopedic, plastic surgery, urology, etc. The hospital started its operations in 2017 and is approved by National Accreditation Board for Hospitals & Healthcare Providers (NABH), National Accreditation Board for Testing and Calibration Laboratories (NABL), and The Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR).

**KMC Nursing & Paramedical Institute** was established in 2018 with aim of providing quality education in the field of Nursing and Paramedics. The institute presently offers **Diploma programs** in Auxiliary Nurse Midwifery (ANM), General Nursing and Midwifery (GNM), and a range of paramedical and life sciences programs. The institute is approved by the Indian Nursing Council and Uttar Pradesh State Medical Faculty. The institute has an **intake of 380 students** across the 12 courses it offers.

**KMC College of Nursing** was established in the year 2019. The institute offers **Graduate program** i.e., B.Sc. Nursing with an **intake of 40 students**. In addition to being approved by the Indian Nursing Council and Uttar Pradesh State Medical Faculty, the institute is also affiliated by Atal Bihari Medical University, Lucknow.



ITM College of Pharmacy was established in 2022. The institute presently offers Graduate program i.e., B. Pharma with an intake of 100 students and Diploma program i.e., D. Pharma with an intake of 60 students. The institute is approved by the Pharmacy Council of India and is affiliated with Dr. A. P. J. Abdul Kalam Technical University, Luknow.

Divya College of Special Education was established in 2022. The institute presently offers Diploma program i.e., D. Ed. with an intake of 105 students. The institute is approved by the Rehabilitation Council of India. With a focus on inclusive learning, the college aims to equip future educators with the skills needed to support individuals with special needs.



Divya College of Health Sciences established in 2022 with aim of providing quality education in the field of Health Sciences. The institute presently offers Graduate programs i.e., Bachelor in Medical Lab Science, Bachelor of Physiotherapy, B.Sc. in Optometry, B.Sc. in Radiology, and B.Sc. in Operation Theatre. The institute has an intake of 200 students across the 5 courses it offers.

To address the region's growing healthcare demands, the foundation expanded its healthcare and educational footprint through the development of KMC Medical College & Hospital under a Public-Private Partnership with the Government of Uttar Pradesh in 2024. The hospital's structure includes four dedicated departments — clinical, pre-clinical, para-clinical, and super-specialty care — ensuring comprehensive treatment and specialized care for a range of complex health conditions. The college has an intake of 150 students for its MBBS course.



## Bridging Gaps: Transforming Healthcare Access and Education

In Maharajganj, a district with an estimated population of 3.4 million people, healthcare infrastructure lags behind national standards, posing challenges to accessible and timely medical care. With only 431 sub-centres, 41 Primary Health Centres (PHCs), and 18 Community Health Centres (CHCs) as of October 2024, the district's healthcare facilities translate to a mere 12.8 sub-centres, 1.2 PHCs, and 0.5 CHCs per 100,000 people. The PHC shortfall is particularly concerning, as these centres are vital for primary care, preventive services, and referrals. Additionally, the doctor-to-population ratio in the state stands at 1 doctor per 2,230 people, underscoring the severe shortage of medical professionals. As a result, patients often had to travel over 55-60 km to Gorakhpur for healthcare.

Shanti Foundation is actively bridging this gap by delivering accessible high-quality healthcare to the region. Empaneled under the Ayushman Bharat Scheme, the foundation provides free OPD and IPD services, along with subsidized charges for tests and treatments — relieving the financial strain on families who would otherwise face expensive private care or go without treatment altogether. Additionally, the foundation's initiative aligns with the National Health Mission by targeting

maternal and child health, non-communicable diseases, geriatric care, and sustainable biomedical waste practices.

Central to Shanti Foundation's impact is the KMC Digital Hospital, which addresses healthcare shortages in both rural and urban India. Given the 80% deficit in specialists at CHCs and 35% shortfall in auxiliary nurse midwives and 5% in doctors at Urban PHCs, the hospital plays a crucial role in bridging these gaps.

In February 2025 alone, the hospital served around 41,150 out-patients and 3,450 in-patients, significantly alleviating the strain on local public facilities.

Shanti Foundation's commitment to sustainable healthcare extends to workforce development. Student enrollment across the courses offered by the foundation surged from 1,003 in FY23 to 1,565 in FY24, reflecting a strengthening healthcare capacity in Maharajganj. With an exceptional student-teacher ratio of 8:1, notably lower than the national average of 10:1 recommended by the Medical Council of India, Shanti Foundation is cultivating a skilled healthcare workforce prepared to address the unique challenges of this underserved region.

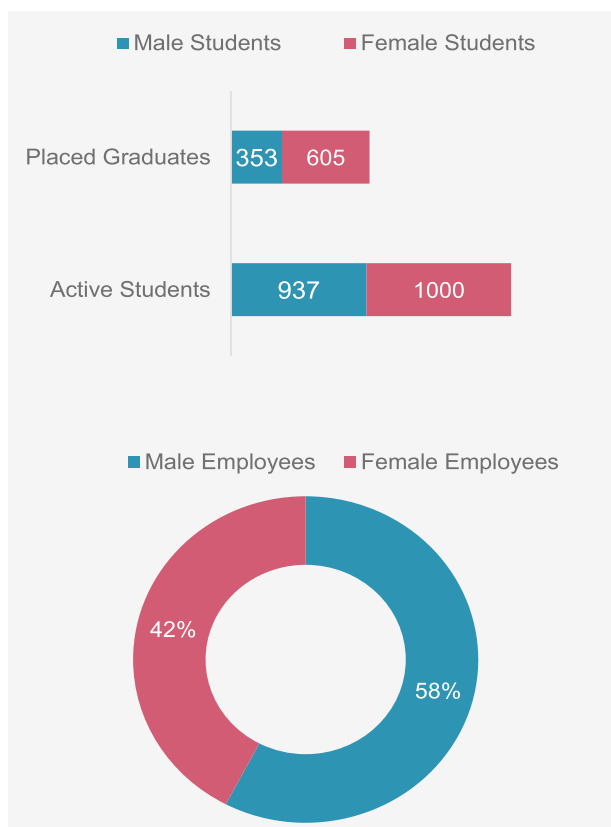
The superior student-teacher ratio enables personalized attention and strong educational support for students, which is crucial for developing highly skilled medical professionals.



## Advancing Women Through Education and Employment

Shanti Foundation is driving meaningful change by equipping women with the education and employment opportunities needed for economic independence. With **52% of current students being female**, the foundation is fostering an inclusive learning environment that empowers women with industry-relevant skills. Through targeted training, mentorship, and career guidance, female students are prepared to enter the workforce with confidence.

The impact extends beyond education. In previous years, **63% of the students placed in jobs have been women**, a testament to the foundation's effectiveness in bridging the gender gap in employment. By partnering with businesses and industry leaders, the foundation ensures that women secure roles across diverse industries, moving beyond traditional job constraints.



This commitment to inclusion is also reflected in its workforce, where **42% of employees are female**. By prioritizing gender diversity within its own organization, Shanti Foundation reinforces its mission of creating equitable professional spaces.



By integrating education, employment, and workplace inclusion, Shanti Foundation is not just supporting individual careers—it is shaping a workforce where women have the skills, access, and opportunities to thrive.



### Healthcare Within Reach: Affordable Excellence for All

The KMC Digital Hospital plays a crucial role in making healthcare accessible and affordable for the residents of Maharajganj and surrounding areas. As a multi-specialty facility, the hospital covers essential departments such as oncology, cardiology, and neurology, eliminating the need for patients to travel long distances for specialized treatments. **Serving around 1,300 patients daily**, with 60% being new, the hospital maintains **84% bed occupancy rate**, demonstrating its effectiveness in addressing the region's healthcare demands. With more than **20 major and 50 minor surgeries performed daily**, the hospital improves patient outcomes by providing timely interventions and quality care.

### Affordable Consultation and Emergency Services

Affordability is a critical aspect of Shanti Foundation's mission, and this is reflected in the foundation's services. **Outpatient consultations** are priced at only Rs. 20, **at one-tenth of the fees charged by larger hospitals**. In addition, the foundation offers **ambulance services for a nominal Rs. 500 per trip**, significantly lower than Uttar Pradesh's government-capped rates, which range from Rs. 500 for Type-A ambulances (first 10 km) to Rs. 2,000 for advanced Type-D ambulances, ensuring that emergency transport is accessible even to the economically disadvantaged population. These affordability measures reduce financial barriers to essential healthcare, supporting improved public health outcomes in the region.

### Affordable and Compassionate Maternity Care

Shanti Foundation also makes a significant impact on maternal health by providing affordable delivery services at KMC Digital Hospital. In India, the cost of a normal delivery ranges between Rs. 2,000 in government hospitals and Rs. 15,000 in private facilities, while a cesarean section ranges from Rs. 5,500 in government hospitals to Rs. 1,50,000 in private hospitals. In contrast, the **foundation charges only Rs. 3,000 for a normal delivery**

and Rs. 6,000 for a C-section delivery. This initiative not only enhances access to vital maternal healthcare but also supports the foundation's mission to improve health outcomes for mothers and infants in the region.



### Advanced Diagnostic and Specialized Treatment

The foundation has advanced diagnostic tools, including MRI and CT scans, at KMC Digital Hospital. Each day, the hospital conducts over 271 microbiology tests, 202 X-rays, 124 ultrasounds, 23 CT scans, and 20 MRI scans—**services previously unavailable locally**. This brings vital healthcare services closer to home, sparing patients the need for lengthy travel. The hospital's nephrology, oncology, and cardiology departments also offer targeted treatments for chronic illnesses, improving access to critical care for local residents. The availability of these diagnostic services ensures timely detection and treatment of conditions like cancer and cardiovascular disease, leading to better patient outcomes.



### Accessible and Affordable Critical Care

To ensure affordability in critical care, KMC Hospital charges **only Rs. 1,500 per day for ICU services**, aligning with public hospital rates and considerably lower than private facilities, where rates can soar up to Rs. 30,000 per day. Affordable diagnostic services, such as **sonography**—essential for timely and accurate diagnosis, especially for maternal and fetal health—are offered at just **Rs. 400 per unit**. This pricing further demonstrates the foundation's commitment to providing accessible healthcare for all in the region.



### Collaborative Partnerships for Community Health

Shanti Foundation has established partnerships to expand its reach and enhance its impact. It has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Uttar Pradesh Police to provide **healthcare services at discounted rates for law enforcement personnel**. Additionally, the foundation has partnered with the

Society to dedicate **30 beds for free treatment of encephalitis**. To further assist low-income families, the foundation launched the Family Health Card Scheme, offering **concessional OPD services** for a nominal annual fee of Rs. 1,000. This initiative fosters early intervention and preventive care, alleviating the financial strain on families who might otherwise delay or forgo essential medical treatment.





## Health Camps and Community Screening

Allocating **Rs. 0.17 million annually**, Shanti Foundation conducts health camps led by KMC Hospital's General Medicine department. These camps focus on early detection and treatment of chronic illnesses like diabetes, hypertension, and asthma, providing essential care to underserved areas. Beyond direct care, the foundation also places a strong emphasis on community health education. The Department of Community Medicine organizes awareness programs that provide vital information on non-communicable diseases, maternal and child health, and geriatric care.

## Accessible Blood Bank Services

The KMC Hospital Blood Bank has been a cornerstone of healthcare in Maharajganj for eight years, providing blood and blood components at a **subsidized rate of Rs. 500 per unit**. This is significantly lower than the national average, which ranges from Rs. 1,550 (Indian Red Cross Society) to Rs. 8,000 (private hospitals). The Blood Bank's affordable services support patients from lower-income families, especially those with chronic conditions requiring frequent transfusions for conditions such as anemia, trauma, or surgical procedures. By maintaining a continuous blood and blood

components supply, including Fresh Frozen Plasma (FFP), and **eliminating replacement requirements**, the foundation ensures timely, life-saving care for those in need. The hospital mitigates blood shortages by hosting regular blood donation camps and leveraging effective inventory management.

## Protecting Our Future: Comprehensive Pediatric Care

The foundation is committed to improving pediatric health by addressing the state's infant mortality rate (IMR), which is 38 per 1,000 live births, above the national average of 28. **Aiming to reduce this to 25 per 1,000 live births**, in line with the National Health Mission's goals, the foundation supports the KMC Digital Hospital's **pediatric center with 75 beds**, providing specialized care for newborns and meeting critical healthcare needs in the region.

In smaller districts like Maharajganj, overcrowding in public facilities often forces multiple newborns to share a single bed in Sick and Newborn Care Units, compromising care quality. This increases the risk of complications for infants with conditions such as neonatal jaundice and respiratory distress. To address these challenges, the hospital offers **individualized care for infants** requiring intensive monitoring and treatment, as well

as routine pediatric services, including vaccinations and chronic condition management. The establishment of specialized units, such as the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) and Pediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU), ensures timely and expert medical attention for at-risk infants. The foundation also focuses on raising awareness of available healthcare services, promoting safe deliveries, and encouraging families to prioritize infant health.

### Gender-Responsive Healthcare: Advancing Equity from Birth

In 2024, Shanti Foundation launched a program to foster gender equity in healthcare, offering a **Rs. 3,000 cash incentive to parents of every girl born at KMC Medical College and Hospital**. This initiative addresses the region's imbalanced sex ratio (943 females per 1,000 males) and promotes institutional deliveries and postnatal care for girls, emphasizing the value of female children in the community.

Additionally, the foundation addresses gender inequality by providing **free education to 50 girls annually**, aiming to bridge the educational gender gap in a region with a female literacy rate of 69%. This initiative empowers young women and paves the way for a brighter, more equitable future for the next generation.



### Crafting Skills, Creating Opportunities: A Commitment to Empowerment

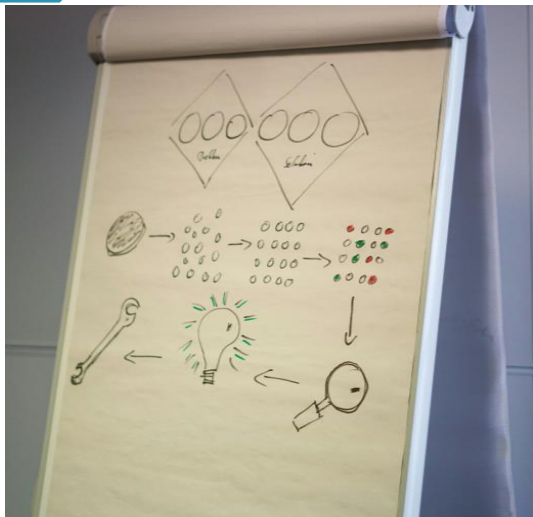
In addition to healthcare training, the foundation plays a pivotal role in the region's socioeconomic development through skill development programs aligned with the Skill India initiative. Annually, approximately **350 individuals are trained** in various trades such as mechanical work, electrical services, and beauty therapy, fostering self-reliance among the youth.

Over the past seven years, the foundation has **empowered around 3,000 unemployed individuals**, significantly improving their employability and economic prospects. The foundation is also committed to the



rehabilitation of physically challenged individuals, having successfully supported over 50,000 people in need.

These initiatives not only enhance the local workforce but also promote social equity and community upliftment.

### Eco-Conscious Care: Shaping a Healthier Future Through Sustainable Practices

Shanti Foundation is dedicated to environmental sustainability through a comprehensive waste management strategy and green initiatives. The foundation ensures the safe disposal of biomedical waste through authorized service providers and incineration, adhering to stringent standards. The foundation's biomedical waste expenses more than doubled from Rs. 0.6 million in FY23 to Rs. 1.5 million in FY24, highlighting the

The foundation has also signed an MOU with the Medical Pollution Control Committee to establish and operate a Common Biomedical Waste Treatment Facility at D-33, UPSIDC Industrial Area, Uttar Pradesh. In addition to this, the foundation also plans to install Effluent Treatment Plants (ETP) and Sewage Treatment Plants (STP) to treat industrial waste from kitchens, laundries, and labs, as well as domestic waste from toilets and hand-wash areas. Specifically, the hospital will have an ETP with a capacity of 86 KLD and an STP of 303 KLD, while the college will have an STP of 215 KLD.

In response to the air quality challenges in Maharajganj, where the AQI is around 82 and PM2.5 levels exceed WHO guidelines, the foundation allocated **Rs. 0.31 million for plantation** initiatives in FY24. These efforts aim to improve local air quality by increasing green cover, as trees act as natural filters to absorb pollutants and enhance oxygen levels. By integrating environmental responsibility into its healthcare operations, the foundation not only addresses waste management but also fosters healthier living conditions and community well-being.



Impact on Output

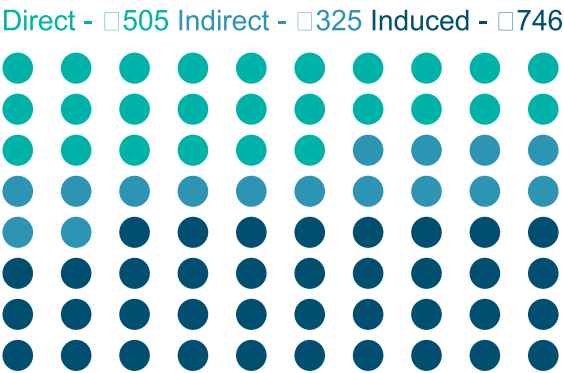
Shanti Foundation generated a **total economic output of Rs. 1,576 million** in FY24. This contribution emanates from three distinct avenues. Firstly, the foundation's **direct contributions** amounted to **Rs. 505 million**, driven by diverse revenue

streams including healthcare services and educational programs.

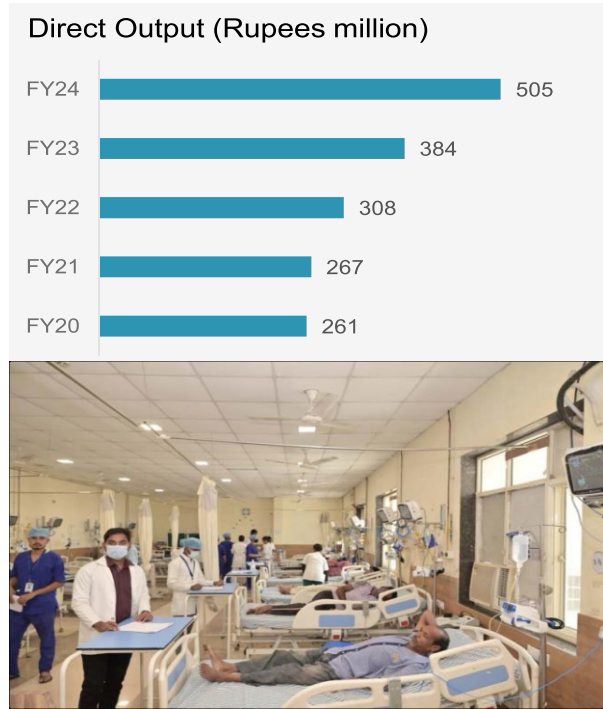
Secondly, an **indirect impact** resulting from the procurement of goods and services from various suppliers yielded an additional **Rs. 325 million**. Indirect output reflects the ripple effect of the company's operations on the broader economy, including economic activity generated in related industries due to the company's demand for inputs and services.

Thirdly, an **induced impact**, driven by the company's employees through their consumption expenditures, amounted to **Rs. 746 million**. This represents the output created when employees spend their incomes on housing, groceries, transportation, and other expenses within the local or regional economy, capturing the multiplier effect as spending circulates through the broader economy, creating additional economic value.

Over the past five years, **Shanti Foundation generated a cumulative output of around Rs. 5.4 billion** through direct, indirect, and induced contributions. In comparison, the FY25 allocation for social security and welfare under the Ayushman Bharat National Health Protection Mission in Uttar Pradesh was Rs. 4 billion, highlighting the significant scale of the foundation's operations. Notably, the foundation exhibited a Compound Annual Growth Rate (CAGR) of 18%, increasing its direct output from Rs. 261 million in FY20 to Rs. 505 million in FY24. This high growth is particularly significant within the context of Maharajganj, where the limited availability of medical facilities underscores the foundation's vital role in meeting the healthcare needs of the local population.



### Productivity Levels

In FY24, Shanti Foundation generated a direct GVA of Rs. 371 million, supported by an employee base of 804 individuals. This results in an **average per capita GVA of approximately Rs. 0.5 million per employee**, which is significantly higher than India's average per capita GVA of around Rs. 0.2 million. This figure indicates that **each Shanti Foundation employee generates GVA at a rate nearly 2.5 times that of the average citizen**, highlighting the foundation's effectiveness in enhancing productivity within the local economy.

The foundation's commitment to high-quality healthcare and education through its medical college and specialized institutes drives productivity. By adopting efficient operations and investing in comprehensive training,

Shanti Foundation ensures its workforce is equipped to meet the community's diverse healthcare needs.



## Impact on Earnings

In FY24, the foundation directly enabled its employees to generate earnings of Rs. 132 million. With an employee base of 804, this translates to average per capita earnings of around Rs. 164,000 – almost twice the average for Uttar Pradesh. This demonstrates the foundation's role in significantly uplifting local income levels, contributing to improved living standards and economic empowerment within the community. Additionally, the foundation facilitated earnings of Rs. 36 million for individuals engaged in its supply chain and an additional Rs. 62 million through induced economic activity in FY24.

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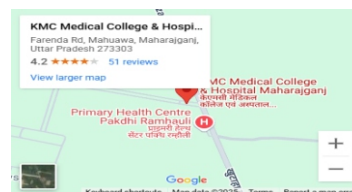

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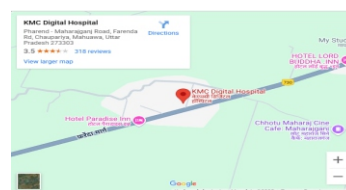

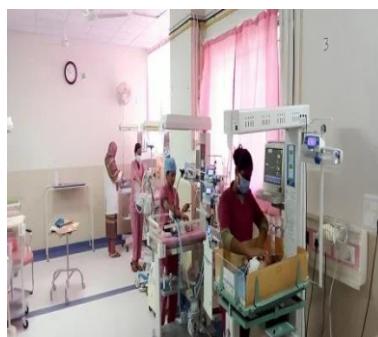

## First med college on PPP model inaugurated in Maharajganj dist

Oct 26, 2024, 01:19 AM IST



Gorakhpur: Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Friday inaugurated the first PPP model KMC Medical College and Hospital in Maharajganj. The medical college was established by the Shanti Foundation. Pankaj Chaudhary, MP and Union minister, was present at the occasion.

"This is a milestone not only for Maharajganj but for all of Uttar Pradesh. Under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership, we have established medical colleges in nearly every district in the state, bringing quality healthcare closer to people's reach," the CM said.

KMC medical college is also set to benefit beneficiaries of the Ayushman Bharat scheme which provides health insurance coverage of up to Rs 5 lakh to economically disadvantaged families. "This will make quality healthcare affordable and accessible for Maharajganj's residents," Yogi said.

Termining the situation prevailing before 2017 due to encephalitis as horrific, he said that now govt has fully controlled the deadly disease. He appreciated the Shanti Foundation and its founder Vinay Kumar Srivastava for setting up the medical college.

Later, at a meeting the CM inspected the construction work of state's first AYUSH University, being built at Pipri, Bhathat. During the visit, he directed officials of the implementing agency to complete remaining tasks by Nov 30 to pave way for the grand inauguration of the AYUSH University in Dec.
